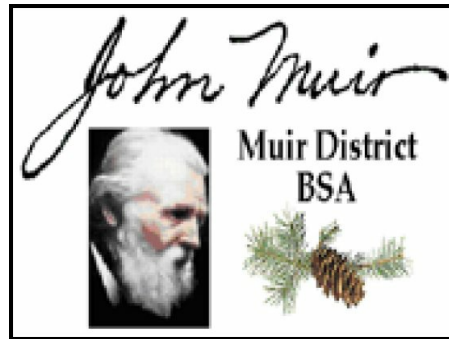

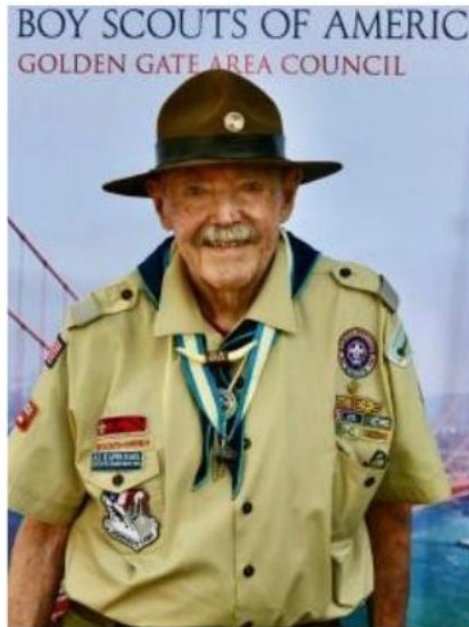

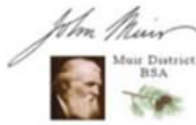

eNews Special Edition Membership Renewal Fee Structure for 2022

July 20, 2022

Golden Gate Area Council (GGAC) Community:

The national fee structure for the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) is being updated as of **August 1, 2022**. Overall, there are modest increases to unit charter/affiliation fees (\$25 increase) and minor increases in the cost of registration for youth members (\$3) and for a *Scout Life* magazine subscription (\$3).

The value of Scouting is undeniable for those within the program and the greater public, and the BSA is committed to continuing to offer this unmatched opportunity to young people and families nationwide.

As costs on many daily goods and services continue to rise dramatically, the BSA has worked to keep its membership fee as low as possible. However, these external pressures continue to have an effect, and the annual national membership fee must be increased to address the fiscal realities necessary to continue delivering a safe and quality Scouting program.

To ensure the organization has the resources to fulfill the promise of Scouting, the following national membership fee structure will take effect **August 1, 2022**.

- **\$75** for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts participants (\$3 increase)
- **\$45** for Exploring participants (no change in cost)
- **\$30** for council-paid memberships (no change in cost)
- **\$45** for all adult volunteers (no change in cost, includes cost of **National Council** background check - the separate LiveScan check to meet AB506 requirements is **not included** in this fee.)
- **\$100** for a unit charter/affiliation fee (\$25 increase)
- **\$25** one-time joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts (Not pro-rated, no change in cost)
- **\$15** for Scout Life magazine; this is the first price increase since 2005 (\$3 increase)

The national membership fee helps cover the cost of essential services, including program resources, liability insurance for those participating in approved Scouting activities, criminal background checks, youth protection,

and the development of intellectual property for national, council, and unit programs. As BSA moves forward, the organization will continue to look at the membership fee structure and how we deliver the Scouting program for future generations.

In addition to the national fees, GGAC charges a council program fee at the time of registration. The CPF is designed to support the basic services that a unit receives from GGAC. The vast majority of the fee (85%) is intended to support program and activities. It is an anchor that allows GGAC to build on those services with additional income from fundraising streams, activity fees, popcorn sales, and endowment revenue. Exploring members are not currently required to pay the CPF. The GGAC Executive Board is evaluating the current CPF and will take action at the August board meeting if any changes are necessary, but the fees remain the same for now (\$66 youth, \$42 adult).

Across the country and in each of our communities, we know that Scouting remains one of the most valuable investments we can make in youth today so they can become the leaders we will turn to tomorrow.

Our dedicated volunteers, staff, and Scouting families make this possible. Thank you for continuing to support one of the most valuable opportunities available to young people today.

AB 506: Live Scan background check (complete ASAP if you have not already)

A Live Scan background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting) is required for all volunteers and staff. Live Scan replaces previous background checks; all volunteers will have to complete this once.

We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California (complete ASAP if you have not already)

Mandated Reporter Training is required in addition to our BSA Youth Protection Training. Volunteer leaders must complete the 2 hour training and upload their certificate at California Scouting by February 28, 2022.

 - Project Name: St. Bonaventure's Rosegarden Trail
 - Project Description: Replacing 360 feet of edge borders of the gravel trail behind St. Bonaventure. The trail is surrounded by bushes of various plants, most importantly the roses. The existing borders were old, broken, and mismatched. They did not prevent the mulch from spilling out onto the trail. The project included trenching the sides of the trail, cutting pressure treated wood border, and installing it in the trench, to hold the gravel in. Existing borders were removed, set aside for disposal to a dump. The ground was soaked before new trenches were dug 5 inches wide and 3 inches deep. Rebar was cut and used to secure the new borders. Gravel was then used to fill in gaps and tamped in. The impact is making the garden look great, and showing gratitude to Troop 444's charter organization, St. Bonaventure Catholic Church.

BALOO Fall 2022 Course
October 22-23, 2022

Many Cub Scouts want to do stuff outdoors, including camping. It's probably why they joined in the first place! In order for your den or your entire Cub Scout Pack to have an outdoor activity or go camping, you must have someone complete the Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation, also known as "BALOO", training course.

BALOO Training is made up of two parts: an online course available on [My.Scouting.org](https://my.scouting.org), and an in-person, hands-on course. You must complete both parts to qualify as a trained outdoor Cub Scout leader. The hands-on course involves camping overnight (after all, that's what the course is about – camping). You're going to learn a lot, from cooking to first aid to campfires to hiking and much, much more.

There will be a Fall BALOO. October 22-23. At Rockville Hills Park in Fairfield. Make sure that your Pack has trained leaders! Sign-up today!

Leave No Trace Trainer Class October 22-23, 2022 Rancho Los Mochos

Participants in this 16 hour (plus an overnight) **Leave No Trace Trainer Course** learn about **Leave No Trace, TREAD Lightly!** and **Wildland Ethics** including teaching techniques necessary for disseminating these critical **Outdoor Ethics** skills to others..

At the completion of the course, all participants will be recognized by the **Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics** as Leave No Trace Trainers and qualified to train Scouts and the community-at-large to be conservation minded.

This course is open to adults and youth who are at least age 14 by the first day of class; all must be currently registered with the BSA. Completion of this course is highly recommended for Scouts who wish to hold the **Outdoor Ethics Guide** position of responsibility and for unit leaders who want to implement Outdoor Ethics effectively within their unit.

Check-in is 7:30 am Saturday, October 22 in the Deadwood Camp of Rancho Los Mochos. The course will run from 8:00 a.m. Saturday, October 22 through 1 pm Sunday, October 23, 2022. The "early bird" price is \$40 (through Friday, October 8) and \$45.00 thereafter with a maximum of 20 participants. Refunds for elective cancellation are 70 to 80% per Council policy and no elective refunds are available after October 8, 2022. Participants will receive further details by email in early October. **All Covid safety requirements of Contra Costa & Alameda Counties, The Golden Gate Area Council and the BSA will be observed including possible mandatory masking.**

This course will be entirely outdoors, in a quasi backpacking format involving an overnight campout and a day hike. Participants will plan, bring and cook their own meals and each participant will be required to give a fifteen minute presentation using the skills they have learned and materials they prepared before the course. Council Contingent Information

The 20th BSA National Scout Jamboree (NSJ) will be held at the **Summit Bechtel Reserve** in scenic West Virginia. This is the third NSJ to feature high-adventure outdoor activities for the *Boy Scouts of America*. Join **Scouts** from around our Council to experience white water rafting, kayaking, rock climbing, rappelling, mountain-biking, skateboarding, shooting sports, zip-line challenge courses and much more!

Dates: Friday, July 14 – Saturday, July 29, 2023 (including DC area tours & travel)
The Jamboree is onsite at the Summit Bechtel Reserve July 19 – July 28, 2023

Cost: \$3,900 (estimated) for Adults Leaders, *Scouts & Venturers*. – *Initial Deposit of \$485 Due upon registration*

Council pricing includes the BSA Jamboree fees, travel and tour expenses, NSJ hat and neckerchief, select Contingent patches, duffel bag, and 2 T-shirts. Participants are responsible for two complete BSA uniforms (required), and spending money for the tour and Jamboree.

Tour: Washington, DC and National Capital area highlights, before traveling to NSJ.

Contingent: Each Troop unit consists of 32 Scouts and 4 Leaders, so positions are limited! Currently, plans are to send 2 Boy and 1 Girl Scout troop, and 1 Crew - depending on sign ups

Eligibility: Scouts must be First Class rank, have completed 6th grade or be 12 years of age by July 19, 2023, but not have reached their 18th birthday before July 28, 2023. Additionally, young adults (18-20) are allowed to participate as 'scouts', but cannot share tents with youth. All participants must have current BSA membership, meet the minimum physical BMI standards (see Jamboree website) and complete an online NSJ Personal Health and Medical Record, and participate in pre-Jamboree troop meetings and the Contingent camping weekend.

Commitment: Troop Meetings (typically one per month starting September 2022)
Patrol Leader Council (PLC) Meetings (youth leaders in Spring 2023)
Occasional Parent Meetings (scheduled at Troop Leaders' discretion)
Contingent Camping weekend (likely Memorial Day Wknd, May 2023)
Council Payment Schedule (released in Spring 2022)
