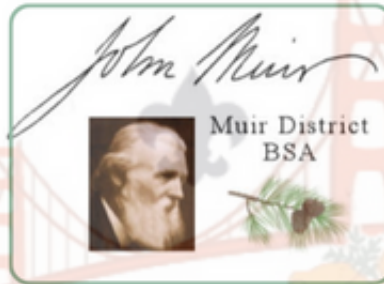

Expand your Registered Leader Roster

Starting in September of this year, there will be new national requirements for overnight Scouts BSA outings. Every adult in overnight attendance at a Scouts BSA event will have to be a registered leader. Most often this will mean registering as an Assistant Scoutmaster or Committee Member, as the Merit Badge Counselor role will not count towards this requirement.

To get ahead of these requirements, review your roster, think about what adults participate in overnight activities, and ensure that they are (or become) fully registered.

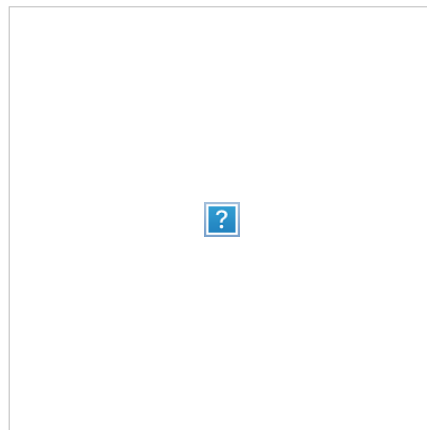

NEW-MEMBER JOINING FEE

ONE-TIME TO JOIN

\$25

Same flat fee no matter when you join during the year. (no prorating) New members pay joining fee in addition to membership fee.

No joining fee for adult volunteers, Exploring participants, participants previously registered in any BSA program, or those transferring from one program to another.

UNIT CHARTER FEE

\$100/YR

For all new and rechartering units.

SCOUT LIFE MAGAZINE FEE

\$15/YR

2023 Council Program Fee Changes to Membership Renewal.

Changes to the Council Program Fee (CPF) are based on the June Consumer Price Index's 12 month change for each year, but are capped at 8%. Beginning August 1, 2023, it will be increased by 2.9%. Click the link to read more about the CPF, set at \$68 per youth and \$44 per adult in our traditional programs (Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts).

The typical member renewal process will also change as of August 1, 2023.

Fees will no longer be prorated. For new members, the anniversary date will be the month they joined. For existing members, the anniversary date will be the 2023 recharter date. Expect more information in the coming weeks about these process changes.

UPDATE: Mandated Reporter Training from the State of California has a 2 year expiration date.

If you were to log in to <https://account.mandatedreportertraining.com/authentication/login> and review your AB 506 Mandated Reporter Training status, you will notice *there is now an expiration date 2 years after you completed the initial training*. Please make sure to complete the AB 506 Mandated Reporter Training for Volunteers again before your respective AB 506 certification expiration date. **Note:** the Live Scan background check is currently NOT required every two years (supposedly just once and done).

Mandated Reporter Training is required in addition to our BSA Youth Protection Training. Volunteer leaders must complete the 2 hour training (or take it again before the expiration date) and upload their certificate here: <https://californiascouting.org/ggac/>.

AB 506: Live Scan background check (complete ASAP if you have not already)

A Live Scan background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting) is required for all volunteers and staff. Live Scan replaces previous background checks; all volunteers will have to complete this once (if you haven't done so already).

We appreciate your patience and assistance as we join all California Youth Service Organizations in improving youth protection.

 - Project: Homeless Shelter Outreach
 - Project Description: The scout wanted to help the homeless community by creating "essential kits" containing basic vital necessities as well as a small flyer having additional places/resources the homeless can access (including the Bay Church in Bay Point, mental health/suicide hotlines, etc.). Scout fundraised on GoFundMe as well as Next Door and asked scouts in the troop to assemble the kits. Due to extra donations, he delivered 50 kits total to a local homeless shelter in Concord (the Concord Adult Homeless Shelter) as well as giving them a \$365 check.

 - Project: Highlands Elementary Mobile Library Boxes
 - Project Description: The scout constructed 2 library boxes at Highlands Elementary School where he was a student when he was younger. Students could leave a book and take a book. GGAC Process for the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge

All Scoutmasters and Committee Chairs received an email from May or June 2022 from the Council Advancement Committee with information about the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge.

The Scoutmaster should:

- Review the Citizenship in Society requirements.
- Review the Scout's record of completed merit badges.
- Discuss cohort participation with Scout and parent. Determine readiness.
- Complete the on-line form to submit a virtual blue card: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSca_YGcCVSBSxU-XIKSNhcmrZjr12UkrajEIWcAcy2CSuRKcw/viewform
- Ensure the parent is connected to Scout in Scoutbook as all communication and Merit Badge sign-offs will occur through Scoutbook.
