





#### **Dates**

Hazardous Weather Training is available at any time online as part of the Training section of <u>My.Scouting.org</u>. If you've never visited this site before, you'll need to click the "create account" button and then follow the instructions; have your Scouting America membership ID number handy.

#### Location

There is no physical location as the course is only offered online through the Training section of <u>My.Scouting.org</u>.

#### Cost

There is no fee to complete Hazardous Weather Training.

#### Registration

You do not have to pre-register for Hazardous Weather Training. Simply log in to <u>My.Scouting.org</u> and visit the Training section to take the course.

#### Renewal

All direct contact leaders must renew this training every two years.


